June 10-12 and July 8-10 2022

Safety Actions

• Promote healthy hygiene practices

- Encourage the use of face coverings in buildings and when social distancing is not possible.
- Have adequate supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviors, including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol, tissues, and no touch trash cans.
- Require anyone feeling ill or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 to stay home and not participate. Signs will be posted encouraging anyone feeling ill to go home.

• Intensify Cleaning, Disinfection, and Ventilation

- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at least daily and shared objects between each use.
- Bathrooms will be cleaned daily by an adult over the age of 18.
- Ensure safe and correct application of disinfectants and keep them away from children.
- Ensure Social Distancing
 - Limit the size of gathering by pre-registering. All registration forms will be available online at least a month before the event.
 - Ensure that staff is available to space trailers such that social distancing can be maintained.
 - Modify methods used to receive entry forms and payment
 - Pre-register participants, fill out registration prior to event, contact show committee for stall arrangements.
 - Restrict the number of workers in shared spaces, such as the entry booth and announcer booth.
 When possible household groups having routine contact with one another should be recruited for this task.
 - Ring stewards and the ring crew will be required to respect social distancing guidelines.
 - There will not be any events in which presents mitigation concerns (specifically Tandem Bareback and Rescue Race).
- Train all Staff and Volunteers
 - **o** Workers will be trained prior to the event in the above safety actions.

Limit Points of Contact

- Common Seating Areas
 - Participants will be encouraged to stay at their trailer while not showing and may bring their own canopy and seating, while maintaining social distancing guidelines.

• Entry Booth

- All efforts will be made to limit the use of the Entry Booth by participants.
- Ensure adequate supplies are available to minimize sharing of high touch materials to the extent possible.
- Avoid sharing electronic devices whenever possible.

• Entry and Exit Gates

• These areas must remain clean and only be operated by workers designated by the Show Committee.
